




RSCN MEMBER PROFILE Eng. Wael Sadji

When Wael Sadji was a boy, he played in the streets of Jerusalem, his hometown. As he grew into his teenage years, he explored the countryside surrounding Jerusalem with his friends, hiking through the deep, boulder-filled valleys and splashing in the ephemeral streams of Wadi Al-Qalt, situated just east of the Jordan River. It was the year 1945, and, Wael, an energetic and bright 14-year-old, had already developed a love for the beauty of nature.

Several years ago, Wael, who now heads an engineering firm in Amman, became a member of RSCN to connect with people who shared a love for the outdoors. One day last spring, he received an email from RSCN regarding an organized trip to the Mujib Reserve. Although he had ignored many similar emails in the past, this time an urgent thought flashed through his mind: "If I don't make this trip now, I may never do it." So, at the age of 78, he signed up for the adventure.

Upon reaching Mujib, Wael's mind flooded with memories from Wadi Al-Qalt. "The beautiful views, the massive boulders, and the roaring river immediately brought back those days from 1945," he observed. He recalled a principle that had impacted him in his youth, the command, "Know your country." "When you know your country, you love it more, you would do anything for it," he stated with emotion. And although Wadi Al-Qalt and Mujib may be on opposite sides of the Jordan River, to Wael they represent a continuous landscape, still as beautiful - and memorable - as it was 64 years ago.



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
