History of Protected Areas in Jordan

In 2011, Mujib Nature Reserve was internationally recognized by UNESCO as a biosphere reserve and renamed the Mujib Biosphere Reserve. Established in 1987, this RSCNmanaged biosphere reserve has had many success stories, including effectively ensuring the future of the threatened Nubian Ibex through a re-introduction program.
