This snake belongs to the family Viperidae, and considered one of seven deadly snakes that have been recorded in Jordan. Despite the low number of incidents reported from this snake, it is the most distributed snake in Jordan. The reason behind low incidents is that they prefer the steep sandstone mountains; which is difficult to access by humans.




