#### **History of Protect**ed Areas in Jordan

The first protected areas survey was conducted in 1974. In 1977-78, John E. Clarke conducted a follow-up project, identifying important natural habitats for wildlife species in Jordan. As a result of his research, he recommended a network of twelve sites to be established as protected areas, subsequently conserving 4% of the entire landmass of Jordan.
