

Alligator Snapping Turtle

The alligator snapping turtle is the largest aquatic turtle, measuring between 33-81 cm in length and weighing between 8.7-9.8 kg. The largest recorded specimen weighed a staggering 99.3 kg. This turtle species is native to North America and is named for its resemblance to the American alligator. One interesting characteristic of the alligator snapping turtle is its ability to survive without breathing for up to six months during cold seasons when the upper layer of water is covered by snow. Instead of breathing through their lungs, they utilize a method known as extra-pulmonary respiration, where they push their heads out of the mud to allow gas exchange through the membranes of their mouth and throat.





Little owl

The Umm Qavviq bird belongs to the Strigidae family and is sometimes called the "buzzing woman" due to the bird's ability to repeat its call frequently despite its small range. Interestingly, in the Arabic dictionary, "Qawiq" means "length," which may refer to the bird's relatively long legs. This bird is a resident and a common species in Jordan. It is active during both day and night, often making its home in the cracks of rocks and trees.
